

The youngest ever winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, Malala Yousafzai risked her very life to improve women's rights in Pakistan. When the Taliban took over and prevented girls from attending school, Malala began alerting the world to their plight through an anonymous blog. Her campaigning eventually made her a target, with gunmen boarding her bus and attempting to end her life. In spite of this, Malala made a full recovery and continues to fight to this day for women's rights to education throughout the world.
